Extending children's knowledge

Making vehicles— Previously the children have been interested in making different types

of vehicles from wood . To develop this we will be extending children's ideas and support their skills further by setting up a garage where the children will have the opportunity to become mechanics and mend



cars .We will be researching different types of cars and developing children's knowledge and vocabulary. We also hope to visit a local garage to see different vehicles being repaired .



Paper bag puppets—Many of the children have shown an interest in using the paper bags from our picnics to make their own puppets. We will be following this interest in more detail by researching different types of puppets and the ways in which they move. We will also encourage the children to use different connectors and materials to fasten arms, hair or legs to their puppets.






Introducing new knowledge and skills

This term we will be reading the stories

Owl Babies by Martin Waddell and Wow Said The

Owl by Tim Hopgood.





For many of our children, this term is especially important as they are starting nursery for the first time. Therefore we have chosen the story Owl Babies as it offers the children the opportunity to explore separation and the worries they experience during their settling period.

Initially we will be concentrating on settling our new starters and welcoming back our existing children who we know will play an important part in helping our new children to enjoy nursery .

We will be helping children to form relationships

with their key person and other adults in nursery along with making friends.




We will be introducing the children to the routines and expectations of nursery for example preparing snack ,tidying up, turn taking and looking after each other and the classroom. We will also be helping the children become familiar with the school environment / staff by having visits each week from the different adults who help run our nursery such as head of centre ,office staff, cook, caretaker along with many other adults, so the children all become familiar with different jobs people do at nursery .
