

Extending children's knowledge and skills

Introducing new knowledge and skills

Some ideas for parents /carers

For all of our children this term will be an important time as they are either starting nursery for the first time or returning after a break due to the pandemic.

We will be concentrating first on welcoming back our existing children and then settling our new starters on a gradual basis. We look forward to seeing you all.



Children will be developing their knowledge and skills at this time, as we will be introducing them to the routines and expectations of nursery for example preparing snack, replacing toys where they belong ,turn taking and looking

after each other and the classroom.

We will also be helping children to form relationships with their key person and other adults in nursery along with making friends.






During the summer term the children used their senses to explore the outdoor environment, they ran through the long grass, used sticks to make music and made marks with mud and chalk. We will be extending this interest further

by talking to them about the Big Draw topic of "Climate for Change". We will be developing their knowledge and skills by talking to them about being kind to our earth, recycling and using found objects from our environment to make models, pictures or marks within nursery.

This term we will be reading the story Harry and the Robots written by Ian Whybrow and Adrian Reynolds (illustrator) and Tree by Britta Teckentrup





Both our core stories this term link to the Big Draw Festival. We will be listening to the stories and finding out what Harry does when his Grandma goes into hospital. Then Tree is the perfect book to support the children to find out about the changing seasons and explore the world around them.

The children will have the opportunity to use recycled materials to make their own models or to work collaboratively to make a group model and



explore using a variety of different media such as paint, glue and autumn leaves .

We will also be helping the children become



familiar with the school
environment /staff by having visits
each week from the different
adults who help run our nursery
such as head of school, office
staff, cook, caretaker along with

many other adults, so the children all become familiar with different jobs people do at nursery .

We would like to create family boards within each of the nursery rooms, in order to do this we will be taking photos of the children and their families. This will give
