Extending children's knowledge and skills

<u>The mud kitchen</u> The children have been interested in digging in the mud and transporting



the mud to different parts of the mud kitchen. To extend the children's knowledge we will talk about farms and growth.

Fleur and Hugo our class giant land snails have been another interest for the children. We have explored the patterns on their shells, discussing swirls and stripes and different colours. We have also talked about what the snails need to keep them healthy, we have helped to feed them and to clean out their tank. To build on this interest we will discuss other animals this half term.

Introducing new knowledge and skills

This term we will be reading Oh Dear by Rod Campbell.

We will be exploring farm life and concentrating on listening for noises and sounds in our environment. The



children will learn about baby animal names and we will discuss any farm animals the children might have seen out and about and how big or small the animals are.

Animals The children in blue and yellow room continue to be interested in animals especially

polar bears and penguins and how young penguins hatch from eggs. To build on this interest we will deepen their knowledge by talking about chicks and their life cycles.

<u>Sensory trays</u> In Green room the children have





been exploring objects that move in different directions, such as paint balls making tracks as they roll through the paint. We have been scooping and pouring dried oats and rice and watching carefully as they

fall to the tray. Then we listened to the sounds they made as they hit the surface. This half term we will further develop this interest in sounds and movement as well as mirrors with our core story The Train Ride.

Introducing new knowledge and skills

This term our core stories will be :-The Odd Egg by Emily Gravett and The Train Ride by June Crebbin and Stephen Lambert.





We will also be looking at factual books about farm animals and birds such as ducks, sheep and horses and find out more about them.

Phonics -To help aid the children's knowledge of letters and sounds we will be introducing them to a letter a week in nursery .This will help us to teach the children letter sounds and formations, identify what letters are in their names and what their initial sound is.

Number- We will be looking at numbers to 10 and encouraging the children to identify how many objects are in a set as well as matching numerals to quantities.

We will also start to develop number outside by displaying number lines both horizontally and vertically. For counting and measuring.

Imaginative play— The children will have lots of opportunities to explore small world scenarios. They can use the props to re tell our core stories, and create stories of their own whilst sharing ideas with their friends and adults.

Some ideas for parents /carers

Encourage your child to look for numbers and letters on their way to nursery. Point out numbers on car registrations, house numbers or letters on road signs and shop fronts. You can also help further your children's interest by talking to your child about the letter and sign of the week.
