



# Red Room - 2-3 year olds

#### Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills

Last term the children experienced their first snow of the winter season and what fun they had playing in it,



transporting the snow and enveloping objects in it. This term the children will explore more sensory experiences such as playing with ice, shaving foam and cornflour. Some children may wish to explore early mark making using these

resources and are ideal opportunities to encourage rich language and to help children to develop their understanding of new words.

# Introducing new knowledge and skills

Our Core Story this half term is **That's not my snowman by Fiona Watt** and links well
with the time of year, the sensory
experiences that we will have on offer
and your child's language development.
The children will continue to learn about

taking turns and we will be playing some simple matching games. In red room we will be encouraging the children to be independent, to start putting their own hat, scarf, gloves and coat on, and to help their friends as if they were dressing a snowman.

#### How you can help support your child's learning

Reading stories together and encouraging sensory play are two great ways of encouraging your child's language development. As your child gets older, their mouth muscles must be able to develop so it is a good idea to limit the use of a dummy and bottles with a teat. # Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills

The children in **blue** and **yellow** rooms have been interested in helping to make our play dough by weighing out the ingredients and watching what happens



when it is all mixed together. They have also been using the play dough to make Gingerbread people, talking about the rhythm and repetition from our Autumn 2 core story "Peace at last" and linking it to the Gingerbread Man story.

In green room, the children's play has been linked to the rotation schema. They have shown an interest in things which turn such as spinning tops and wind-up toys. Next half term we will explore this further through our core



story and resources that can be wheeled and rolled. We will also be introducing ready steady go games to their play to help to develop joint attention.


# Introducing new knowledge and skills



Our key story this term in **blue** and **yellow** room is *The Gingerbread Man*. We will go shopping, write lists and read instructions to make our own Gingerbread people. We will draw the children's attention to the parts of the

book such as the cover, author, page numbers and the repeated text within the story. The children will use props and pictures to retell the story and be thinking of different ways to help the Gingerbread Man escape from the fox and avoid being eaten. We will also talk about positional language, such as on top, up, next to, behind, and in front of, by encouraging the children to use this language when acting out the story.

The Very Busy Spider written by Eric Carle is the core story in green room this half term. In this multisensory book, children can feel the pictures as well as see them, while they hear



the easy rhythmic text, and recount the sequence of animals. A spider, blown by the wind to a fence post near a farm yard, begins to build her web and cannot be distracted from the task at hand-not by the horse, cow, sheep, goat, or dog. She goes round and round as she makes her web.

### How you can help support your child's learning

Show your child that maths is in our every day lives by looking for numbers on your way to nursery, such as numbers on car registrations, house numbers, road signs etc. Go to https://www.bbc.co.uk/tiny-happy-people/what-can-we-spot-on-the-way/z6s26v4 for other ideas of games to play while walking to nursery .



Why not try baking Gingerbread biscuits at home together or you could also make play dough with your child. Using playdough will help strengthen muscle tone, to develop fine motor skills and pre-writing skills. Dough can be easily made at home with everyday ingredients, pick up a copy of both the recipes in the
