


will be for the afternoon session and end of the week children. 30 hours children will be split between the two days on a first come basis. More information will be sent nearer the time.

Red Room - 2-3 year olds

Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills

Last term the children in Red room enjoyed extending their schematic play by enveloping and enclosing both themselves in large boxes and




wrapping smaller boxes whilst practising their cutting skills. The children also experienced getting creative with lots of mixed media, and wet and dry glue.

Outside, the children developed their role play skills, communication and language and mathematical development in our builders area as we talked about shapes and practised counting.

This half term Red rooms core story is Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. The children

will explore similarities and differences and talk about families. The story is a bright and colourful introduction to repetitive words and phrases as well as providing lots of opportunities for descriptive language. The children will

THIS HALF-TERM IN NURSERY

Blue, Yellow and Green Rooms—3-5 year olds

Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills

The children in blue and yellow rooms have been interested in taking care of the different flowers and vegetables seeds we planted in pots. We will extend this learning by visiting our allotment



and planting the seedlings into the raised beds where the children will have the opportunity to watch them grow and change. We will be tasting different fruits and vegetables as well.



In green room, the children have been very busy in the maths area, exploring numbers, counting, sorting natural materials and lotto games. They have been exploring numbers to 10 and some have been going

beyond 10. Next half term, we will be introducing the children to the tens frames and numbers beyond 10.

Introducing new knowledge and skills

Our core story this half term in blue and yellow rooms is Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne.



Following on from our core story Handa's Hen, we will be listening to

another story about the adventures of Handa, this time she is visiting her friend Akeyo in the neighbouring village. We will be talking about the different fruits she has in her basket and which they like the best.

We will also be looking at the various animals that steal fruit from Handa's basket which she is carrying on her head.

The children will have the opportunity to explore different patterns that they observe on Handa's clothing.

Over in the Meadow by Jill McDonald is the core story in green room this half term.

Across the meadow, baby animals echo their mothers - and children can listen along and echo too!



As the children read the story they will learn about animals,

their habitats, actions and sounds. The song goes from 1 to 10 so they will also be exploring numbers and counting.

How you can help support your child's learning



At home taste different fruits and vegetables and talk with your child about healthy and unhealthy foods and their likes and dislikes.



Why not have a go at planting some seeds together, you could plant the pips out of an apple or the seeds from tomato slices and
