
Children love to make items move through the air by throwing, jumping, swinging and trailing them.

For all of our children this term will be an important time as they are either starting nursery for the first time or returning after the summer break.



the environment. We will be introducing them to the routines and expectations of nursery for example preparing snack, how to put on an apron and their coat, replacing and helping to put the toys away


Introducing new knowledge and skills



So Much is the core story in blue and yellow room this term, it is written by Trish Cooke and illustrated by Helen Oxenbury.
This adorable book is full of sing-song rhythmic text, repeated phrases and Caribbean dialect. This

cumulative story captures the joy of being a baby in a large extended family. The children will be able to talk about family memories such as places they visited in the holidays. We will be exploring feelings such as happy and sad. We will be talking about birthdays and helping our persona doll celebrate their birthday by making invitations, cards, writing shopping lists for party food and wrapping pretend presents. A small group of children will also go to Asda to buy ingredients to bake a cake for the party.

If You're Happy and You Know It is the core story in green room this half term sung by Susan Reed who believes that music and story broaden our understanding of the world. Children all over the world clap hands, stomp feet
