A warm welcome back to all our existing and new children and their families. We hope you've had a relaxing holiday and a Happy New Year to you all.




Sunday 15th January 2023 is the deadline for Primary School applications only for children that turn 5 from 1st September 2023 to 31st August 2024. Please contact

Red and **Purple** Rooms – 2-3 year olds


Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills



Last term the children in both **red** and **purple** rooms have been very interested in the sensory dark den. They have been exploring the different lights and textures of the materials. In order to deepen the

children's interests we will be exploring a variety of sensory experiences such as cornflour, paint, ice and

shaving foam. The children have also been interested in the sensory circuit time which has been a new experience for them. They have been developing moving their bodies when using the equipment and dancing to the music. We

The children have continued their interest in sing along stories and movement. **The More We Get Together** written by Cleleste Cortright and illustrated by Betania Zacarias is our

core story in **red** and **purple** room. In order to deepen the children's knowledge we will be talking about friendships, looking after each other and the environment. The children will also use recycled materials to make a group model.

THIS HALF-TERM IN NURSERY

Blue, Yellow and Green Rooms—3-5 year olds

Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills



The children in **blue** and **yellow** rooms have been showing schematic play in the form of connecting and disconnecting. We noticed that there has been lots of interest in building with blocks both indoor and out

as well as using loose parts. To extend this further we will explore other ways to build such as with clay or small bricks and sand. We will also take small groups to look at buildings in our local area.

The children in **green** room have been exploring the enveloping schema, where they have been layering up materials as well as covering themselves and objects. To develop this, we will be introducing different materials to our sensory den. They have also been interested in different ways of moving during our sensory circuit, this is something we will develop further through our core story.

Introducing new knowledge and skills



The Three Little Pigs is the core story in blue and yellow rooms this half term. We will be reading different versions of the story and asking the children to talk about them. They will be encouraged to

retell the story to their friends and the adults in nursery and talk about what they like / dislike about the story. In order to deepen the children's knowledge we are going to look at different types of homes, the

materials they are made of, along with houses from around the world and have a visit from builder Evan. We will be looking at different types of plans and supporting the children to record their ideas in a variety of ways such as drawing or using the iPad.

Walking Through The Jungle by

Barefoot books is the core story in green room this half term. It is a lively singalong book that is illustrated by Debbie Harter and sung by Fred Penner.



The children will hike through the rainforest, scale a mountain, swim across the ocean, and still make it home for dinner. This book has lots of rhyme and repetition which is something that we will expand on to become familiar with the story as well as exploring movement animal sounds and signs.

How you can help support your child's learning

Show your child that maths is in our every day lives by looking for numbers on your way to nursery, such as numerals on car registrations, house numbers, road signs etc. Go to https://
