Red and **Purple** Rooms – 2-3 year olds

Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills



The children in **red** and **purple** room have been fascinated by the ducklings that visited nursery last half term. In the rooms, this has led to lots of discussions about how they were growing, how best to care for them and what they like to eat and

drink. This half term we will be extending this learning through our core story, where we will be observing how plants grow and what they need to thrive.

Introducing new knowledge and skills



Jaspers Beanstalk by Nick Butterworth and Mick Inkpen is the core story in red and purple room this half term. It is a colourful book where Jasper plants a bean and he waits for it to grow into a

beanstalk all week. We are going to extend the children's knowledge by planting seeds, watching them grow and then transferring them to our vegetable patch at the allotment. We will introduce new vocabulary related to size and growing.

How you can help support your child's learning

Now the warmer weather is here and we can enjoy spending more time outside, the garden can be a fun place for little ones to learn as



it's full of colourful flowers, plants and maybe even a few friendly gnomes. They'll love being allowed to play with water too, which can be much easier than in the house. THIS HALF-TERM IN NURSERY

Blue, Yellow and Green Rooms—3-5 year olds

Extending children's interests, knowledge and skills



The children in **blue** and **yellow** rooms have been interested in taking care of the ducklings that came to nursery and also helping to plant a variety of vegetable and flower seeds. We will

extend this learning by visiting our allotment and planting the seedlings into the raised beds, where the children will have the opportunity to watch them grow and change. We will be tasting different fruits and vegetables we grow as well.

The children in **green** room have developed an interest in mark making and have been

busy making marks on paper, on whiteboards and on the smart board. To extend this interest, we will be linking activities to our core story where will explore big/ tall, small/short marks, wavy and straight lines and use ribbons to create shapes in the air.

Introducing new knowledge and skills

The Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle is the core story in blue and yellow rooms this half term. The children will have the opportunity to retell the story as the caterpillar grows from an egg to cocoon and then to



a beautiful butterfly. To extend their learning further we will also look at the days of the week , numbers and counting. We will try the different foods the caterpillar eats on his journey through the book and talk about foods that are healthy and unhealthy. We will be



welcoming the live butterfly garden to nursery where we will watch the process of the caterpillars transforming into butterflies, bringing **The Very Hungry Caterpillar** story to life. Jack and the Beanstalk by Iona Treachy is the core story in green room this half term. This bright and colourful picture book contains lots of rhythm and rhyme. Following on from the previous core story the children



will have chance to extend their learning and interest in rhythms. We will be planting seeds and watching them grow taller and taller and bringing the story to life through sensory trays, construction and movements.

How you can help support your child's learning



At home taste different fruits and vegetables and talk with your child about healthy and unhealthy foods and their likes and dislikes.
